Intermountain Vintage Racing had a few rough moments getting underway in 1994, but managed to pull off a great hillclimb at Bear Hollow, outside of Park City, as well as a race driver's school in October. The plans for 1995 include both these events, a car show at Valley Fair Mall as well as some real races!

The second annual Bear Hollow Hillclimb is currently scheduled for



June 16th and 17th. Participation should be well up from the 1994 level, so you may need to plan ahead to get in. Prior to the hillclimb, IVR will run a driving school and road race at Bonneville Raceway the weekend before Memorial Day, May 20 and 21. A test and tune day is scheduled for July, again at Bonneville, and there are plans for a vintage street race in the Park City area near the end of August. Stay tuned for more info!

The Utah Region SCCA will also continue their Solo II program, in conjunction with the Hill Sports Car Club. If the snowy weather actually slows down in the spring as it usually does, the first autocross of the 1995 season will be March 26th. The schedule may not be as heavy as this past summer, to avoid conflicts with IVR and other club events, but there should still be autocrosses 3 or 4 times each month through the summer.

And given the rather poor turnout of the British Motor Club at the U of U event in May, perhaps the Fat Chance garage will have to entice folks out by offering a special deal on the entry fees again. We shall see.
