

trouble shooting, and good maintenance practices. J. pointed out that all electrical devices in our precomputer cars are either lamps or magnets (including motors, generators, and coils). He emphasized that the small number of fuses in our 50's and 60's era cars dictate that

extra fuses be put in line to isolate problems and aid in fault location. Careful planning should precede the addition of modern "upgrades" such as entertainment systems and high powered headlamps, since the existing wiring may not be up to the additional demands. J. emphasized that connections are the biggest source of electrical problems, and soldered wire tips, clean connectors, and dielectric grease are the main defenses against pesky failures. Discussion was lively as attendees reported their own experiences, suggestions, and good/hard luck stories.
