9000 South and Redwood Road was our departure point for this year's fall tour. Ogden Station Museums Tour Saturday, November 11

The Tech Session scheduled for Saturday November 11 has transmogrified into a tour of the Ogden Union Station Museums. According to the AAA Tour Book for Utah:

The site contains four museums and two art galleries. Gallery at the Station showcases fine art; the Myra Powell Gallery features the station's permanent art collection.

The Utah State Railroad Museum depicts U.S. railroad history through films, memorabilia and a miniature train. The John M. Browning Firearms Museum displays handguns, rifles and larger firearms. The Browning-Kimball Car Museum exhibits a collection of vintage automobiles. Also displayed is an 1881 narrow-gauge steam engine. The National History Museum contains items ranging from fossils and arrowheads to a 44,000-carat piece of quartz weighing 19 pounds.

Guided tours are available. Allow 1 hour, 30 minutes minimum. Mon.-Sat. 10-6, Memorial Day-Labor Day; 10-5, rest of year. Closed Jan. 1, Thanksgiv-

ing, and Dec. 24-25. Admission \$5; over 62, \$4; ages 2-12, \$3. Phone (801) 393-9886.
