Dimmer: Don't listen to my brother, who wouldn't know a BSW tap from a tap dancer. Actually, even though we talk a lot about Whitworth fasteners for our 50's and earlier cars, in reality Whitworth a.k.a. BSW threads aren't used on them. Instead, our cars use BSF threads -- the necessary wrenches are Whitworth sized, but the threads are BSF, not BSW.

Q. What's a bypass thermostat, and why should I care? -- Bypassed in Bingham

Dim: Bypassed, bypass thermostats are very important -- 4 of them are used when a cardiologist gives you a quadruple bypass operation.

Dimmer: You dummy! The only ticker you'll ever operate on is a Lucas fuel pump. A conventional thermostat blocks engine coolant flow to the radiator until a set temperature is

reached. A bypass thermostat does this too, but when it opens it also cuts off flow to a coolant bypass circuit.

If your car has a coolant bypass pipe, and you use a regular thermostat, cooling efficiency is significantly reduced, because a significant amount of engine coolant (perhaps 25%) at operating temperature is short circuited around the radiator. Ask any MGA or XK Jaguar owner!
