of cars owned by a local enthusiast.





Roy Alan Beale 1936-2008

The BMCU lost a dear friend and sage on December 29 when Roy Beale passed away.

According to his obituary in the Salt Lake Tribune "[Roy] was born on March 24, 1936 in Birmingham, England to George and Edna Makin Beale. Roy married Patricia Joseph on October 13, 1956 and later divorced. He married Linda Phillips on March 21, 1991.

"Roy was a master mechanic and loved British cars. Roy immigrated to the U.S. in November 1962. He built Formula #1 Race Cars and was secretary of the British Car Club.

"Roy was a huge history buff. He loved

animals and especially his dogs. Roy was a great teacher, a master handyman and a great storyteller. He was a boxing and soccer coach and an "amazing grandpa." Roy is survived by his wife, Linda; children, Tony (Brenda), Michael, Julie (Todd) Will, Jennifer Thornton, Kimberli (Ryan) Ure, Tanya (Chris) Packer, and Brian Packer; 12 grandchildren; 17 great-grand-children; three sisters, Audrey, Joan and Marjorie; brother, Doug; and his dogs, Sam and Daisy."

I first met Roy soon after Sandy and I arrived in Salt Lake City in January 1977. We had shipped out our MG TD, and it needed some TLC to be made legal and roadworthy. I looked in the

phone book and saw the *Mr. British* repair shop that Roy ran on 300 West.

I brought in the car, and was immediately struck by Roy's droll wit and encyclopedic knowledge of all things British, especially cars.


From time to time I would stop in his shop for inspection, parts and repair of our TD, and was greatly disappointed when Roy closed the shop, though he continued to do repair and restoration work in retirement from his home in Kearns.

I recall especially well the BMCU tech session conducted November 1996 at Bailey's Sinclair in Murray. I had just rebuilt my TR3A gear box (learning on the job, of course), and had difficulty with it staying in second gear. I removed the top cover, Roy poked around with two screwdrivers for a few seconds, and quickly diagnosed the exact problem — a spacer was in the wrong position on the output shaft.

I trust that all BMCU members, especially those who knew and appreciated Roy's unique qualities, will join in extending our condolences to Roy's family and friends — and oh yes, his beloved dogs.

Roy will be greatly missed.

#### Tool Uses and Definitions, cont'd from p. 2

HACKSAW: One of a family of cutting tools built on the Ouija board principle. It transforms human energy into a crooked, unpredictable motion, and the more you attempt to influence its course, the more dismal your future becomes.

VISE-GRIPS: Generally used after pliers to completely round off bolt heads. If nothing else is available, they can also be used to transfer intense welding heat to the palm of your hand.

OXYACETYLENE TORCH: Used almost entirely for lighting various flammable objects in your shop on fire. Also handy for igniting the grease inside the wheel hub out of which you want to remove a bearing race.

TABLE SAW: A large stationary power tool commonly used to launch wood projectiles for testing wall integrity.

HYDRAULIC FLOOR JACK: Used for lowering an automobile to the ground after you have installed your new brake shoes, trapping the jack handle firmly under the bumper.

BAND SAW: A large stationary power saw primarily used by most shops to cut good aluminum sheet into smaller pieces that more easily fit into the trash can after you cut on the inside of the line instead of the outside edge.

TWO-TON ENGINE HOIST: A tool for testing the maximum tensile strength of everything you forgot to disconnect.

PHILLIPS SCREWDRIVER: Normally used to stab the vacuum seals under lids or for opening old-style paper-and-tin oil cans and splashing oil on your shirt; but can also be used, as the name implies, to strip out Phillips screw heads.

STRAIGHT SCREWDRIVER: A tool for opening paint cans. Sometimes used to convert common slotted screws into non-removable screws and butchering your palms.

PRY BAR: A tool used to crumple the metal surrounding that clip or bracket you needed to remove in order to replace a 50 cent part.

HOSE CUTTER: A tool used to make hoses too short.

HAMMER: Originally employed as a weapon of war, the hammer nowadays is used as a kind of divining rod to locate the most expensive parts adjacent the object we are trying to hit.

UTILITY KNIFE: Used to open and slice through the contents of cardboard cartons delivered to your front door; works particularly well on contents such as seats, vinyl records, liquids in plastic bottles, collector magazines, refund checks, and rubber or plastic parts. Especially useful for slicing work clothes, but only while in use.

DAMN-IT TOOL: Any handy tool that you grab and throw across the garage while yelling 'DAMN-IT' at the top of your lungs. It is also, most often, the next tool that you will need.
