Brief early TRIUMPH history...

- Sigfried Bettmann, German immigrant, began his bicycle business in London in 1885
- In the 1890's the name TRIUMPH was born
- In 1902 the Triumph motorcycle was introduced
- Bettmann prospered and had capital to invest in Standard Motor Company
- 30,000 550cc motorcycles ,"trusty Triumphs," were shipped to France in WWI
- Triumph's first car, the 10/20, was brought out in 1923
- In 1924 hydraulic brakes were fitted to all four wheels
- In 1927 the Super Seven was introduced
- Super Seven won many speed and endurance challenges
- In 1935 the Southern Cross, an open car with fold down windscreen and wire wheels joined the Gloria line.
- Donald Healey built the Triumph Dolomite Straight Eight for the 1935 Monte Carlo (only 3 were built)
- 1936 the motorcycle division was sold
- 1939 the company went on the auction block
- Essentially nothing was left of Triumph by the end of WWII
- 1944 Standard purchased the name Triumph
- In 1946 the Triumph-badged 1800 Roadster was designed by Frank Callaby with aluminum body over tubular steel fame
- The TR-X prototype never reached production
- A prototype TR1 was at the 1952 Earls Court Motor Show
- May 20, 1953 a TR2 topped 124 mph at Jabbeke Road in Belgium
- The TR designation included the 2, 3, 4, 4A, 5, 250, 6, 7 and 8.


British Motor Club of Utah "Once Around the Lake" April 14th cruise




